

Beech Class Autumn Term - 2nd half overview 'One World, One Family'

ENGLISH

Year One will be reading, writing and performing poems this half term and will have a focus on finding patterns and rhymes in poetry. Additionally, our class book for this half term is 'Peace at Last'. The children will practise their letter formation of lower case and capital letters, consistently use capital letters and full stops, understand the difference between common and proper nouns and start to use conjunctions (and, but, so) in their writing. The children will continue to have daily phonics sessions as well.

MATHS

This half term, the children will be continuing to add and subtract numbers using a variety of equipment and strategies. We will be learning the number bonds to 10 and learning the order of numbers to 20, being able to calculate the greater and lesser number. Year One will also learn about 3D and 2D shapes and their properties.

SCIENCE

Seasonal changes:

The children will be looking at the weather and how it changes over the year. We will be observing the weather first hand, watching weather forecasts, measuring rainfall, wind direction and temperature.

HISTORY

We will compare life now as a child to the past and learn about significant local people and historical figures.

GEOGRAPHY

The children will be identifying daily weather patterns around the UK and will learn about hot and cold areas around the world.

ART AND DESIGN TECHNOLOGY

Year One will start an art project based around the book 'Where the Wild Things Are'.

PE

Outdoor sports - RJG Sports.
Indoor PE - practising and performing dances for the Christmas play using simple movement.

COMPUTING

Year 1 will learn how to write and test simple programs using a floor robot. They will also use cameras to record photographs and videos to use in a variety of lessons.

RE/SEAL

We will continue to focus on churches, learn about Diwali, Advent and Christmas celebrations.

MUSIC

Learning songs for the Christmas play and being able to sing in unison. Listen to live music instruments and recognising different types of beats.

Making art in the forest and Christmas decorations using natural resources.
