ENGLISH

Children will revise and consolidate phonemes and common exception words taught in Year One. Children will also focus on securing basic writing skills during the first half term. This includes using the following accurately across a range of writing:

- Capital letters and full stops
- Spacing between words
- Forming letters in the correct size/orientation in relation to another
- Increase the accuracy of spelling common exception words correctly

Goldilocks and the three bears

Story writing

- Planning and saying out loud what we want to write about
- Writing down our ideas and recording new words
- Create a simple fairy tale story

Letter writing

- Layout and text features
- Formality of writing
- Evaluating writing with the support of the teacher and other pupils

SCIENCE

Animals, including humans

- Notice that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults
- Find out about and describe the basic needs for survival
- Describe the importance for humans to exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food and hygiene

MATHS

Number: Place value

- Read and write numbers to 100 in numerals and words
- Recognise place value in two digit numbers
- Estimate numbers using different representations
- Count in steps of 2, 3 and 5 from 0
- Count forwards and backwards in tens from any number
- Compare and order numbers to 100 using < and > signs

Number: Addition and Subtraction

- Recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 fluently
- Add and subtract two-digit numbers and ones; a two-digit number and tens; two two-digit numbers.

DESIGN TECHNOLOGY

Fairy tale themed hand puppets

- Research different types of puppets
- Identify design criteria
- Design and generate 'mock-up' of puppet
- Develop basic sewing techniques
- Use appropriate finishing techniques
- Evaluate puppet against design criteria

- Why did his reign come to an end?
- Use of timelines
- Historical vocabulary to compare and contrast
