### ENGLISH

Continuing targets for all children to focus on this half term:

Number: Addition and Subtraction

- Add and subtract two 2-digit numbers using formal written methods
- Bonds to 100
- Adding three 1-digit numbers

Measurement - Money

- Recognise symbols used for pounds and pence
- Find different amounts of coins that make the same amount of money
- Solve two-step problems in a practical context including giving change
