We are delighted to confirm that a new school meals provider Orian will be starting in the kitchen on Monday 22nd April. This means we will have a fresh new exciting school meals menu and a new system for ordering and making payments, called School Hub. Our school meals team create a great menu of fresh, home-cooked and nutritionally balanced meals every day including a range of different fresh-baked breads.

Important changes to note -

Meals must be ordered in advance from home (we will no longer have the option to do this from school)

Dessert is also ordered in advance as well as the main meal.

Meals must be paid for in advance, the system will not allow you to order if account is not in credit.


If a child arrives at school without ordering a meal, you will be contacted by the school office.
